When and How to Contact Emergency Services

When to call 911:

Anytime you need to speak with an Officer to report a crime or a suspicious activity that is currently occurring.

When to contact the City Police Desk (24hr) (406) 552-6300:

To make a report or speak with an Officer about a minor and not in progress incident which occurred within city limits. (You might be transferred to dispatch 911, which is normal).



Tips for Maintaining Personal Safety

- Trust your gut, if something feels wrong, strange, not right, etc., there is something wrong.
- Invest in a doorbell camera or video surveillance.
- Do not answer the door for people you do not know.
- Do not allow people you don't know into your house.
- Do not walk in public with money in your hand.
- Have your house key in hand when you get to your door.
- Use your key fob to unlock your car just before you get to the door.
- Give a spare house key to a trusted friend or neighbor.
- Keep your doors locked, even if you are home.
- If you use a hide-a-key, put it in a place that will be difficult for someone to find.



Tips for Maintaining Financial Security - 1

Financial Security:

- Don't answer phone calls from people/umbers you do not know.
- Install nuisance call blocker on your cell phone (go to cell store and ask for help).
- If you answer and you do not know them, hang up.
 Its okay to be rude to them.
- Do not provide or verify any personal information to anyone you did not call (date of birth, social security number, bank account numbers, credit cards).
- Do not clink on links in e-mails. Type in the web address of the company and go to their page from their website.
- You did not win the lottery, contest, etc. if you did not purchase a ticket.



Tips for Maintaining Financial Security - 2

Financial Security continued:

- Business or government agencies will NEVER accept payment, for anything, with gift card numbers over the phone.
- Business or government agencies will NEVER ask you to mail cash.
- If your grandchild calls in the middle of the night and needs bail money, let them sit in jail overnight. (It is not really them calling)
- If someone tells you that you are not allowed to hang up on them, they are lying. Hang-up!
- You never have to pre-pay a fee/tax for winning a prize, contest, lottery.
- The US government is not going to give you money for free (except those two times for COVID).



Tips for Maintaining Financial Security - 3

Financial Security continued:

- If someone is persistent and demands an immediate answer, tell them you need to discuss it with your son/daughter, who happens to be a Police Officer. If they still won't relent, hang-up!
- Use phrases for passwords. i.e. HolyCow!1,
 MammaMia!1. They are easier to remember,
 harder to guess, and the capitalization, number
 and punctuation make them difficult to crack.
- Use different passwords for each different purpose i.e. Netflix, bank, credit card etc.
- It is okay to say no to people, if you have questions or doubts, call one of the emergency numbers and ask!
