RECREATIONAL VEHICLES, UTILITY TRAILERS, RV'S BOATS, RAFTS AND CAMPERS

According to our Covenants, these types of vehicles are only permitted to be on the street or in your driveway for not more than 48 hours. They are not permitted to block the sidewalk in any way. If you need a little more time to load, clean or unload please let us know why and contact claudiah@pleasantviewhomes.org. The HOA does enforce the covenants based on your phase number and location. NEVER place an extension cord across a sidewalk, this is a City violation and can be reported to the City Police.

JUST SOME REMINDERS

- Please remember we live in the City and there is a Leash Law. All dogs must be on a leash.
- •We have several Dog Stations throughout our neighborhood and Hellgate Meadows. Please clean up after your dog.
- •Now is the time to be doing some outside clean up around your home and yard. Please keep your trees and lawns watered.
- •APHIDS please spray and treat your trees early. It does help.
- •Boulevard trees belong to the City but are the responsibility of the homeowner/tenant to keep them watered and sprayed for Aphids. If you notice a tree is dead or a limb is hanging over the sidewalk, please contact claudiah@pleasantviewhomes.org.
- •Our neighborhood is notorious for Dandelion populations. It is very important to treat the little weeds as soon as possible. Digging them up only stimulates growth.
- •If you have a vehicle that is not working, it must be stored in your driveway or garage and not parked on the street. If left in the street, the City can be called to have it tagged and removed.
